



MaSC Project Workshop 2 Report

Overview

Workshop 2 was held at the Davenport Hotel in Dublin on 7 and 8 December 2015, 44 delegates attended the workshop including 4 contractors and the 9 members of the project team. Workshop 2 focused on the requirements for a Mass Shelter settlement. There were eight sessions that took place over the course of the workshop with each one focused on a different aspect of Mass Shelter and comprising a mixture of presentations and tasks to be completed by the delegates.

Workshop Content and Tasks

Workshop 2 was opened by David Hickey as the host of the workshop. Session 1 detailed the outputs that had been developed from the work that the delegates produced at Workshop 1. Project Manager Matthew Hoy, presented this and the video of the presentation can be viewed [here](#). The delegates then spent time reviewing the outputs from Workshop 1. The session concluded with a presentation from project team members Maren Jaschke and Stephan Mack on the composition of civil protection modules, this presentation can be read [here](#).

Session 2 started with a presentation by Lynne Davis from the UK Department of Communities and Local Government, which can be viewed [here](#). The majority of the session was then comprised of delegates developing a MaSC triage and registration process.

Session 3 focused on what would be required within the MaSC household units, the delegates spent most of this session discussing what would need to be provided at the household level. A presentation was given by Tim De Haas of Better Shelter Solutions on how their product was developed and is used, the presentation can be viewed [here](#). With further information, the delegates then re-evaluated their household units solution.

Session 4 began with a presentation from Emre Gok and Cigdem Mutlu, of the Disaster and Emergency Management Authority Turkey, who discussed the management of Syrian Migration camps in their country, this presentation can be viewed [here](#). Following this the delegates then completed a task on what would need to be included in MaSC at the community level.





Day 2 began with a recap on the previous day, followed by a presentation from Dr Darrell Jaya-Ratnam, of DIEM consulting on the development of the MaSC Model following the previous workshop. The delegates then completed a task on the key questions that the model would need to answer. Hans van der Made, from the Department for Physical Planning and Sustainability Amsterdam presented on his experience of the design features at the Zaatari camp in Jordan which can be viewed [here](#). Jaap Graber from PLAN-Modules then continued this theme with a presentation on Mass Shelter design, which can be viewed [here](#). The delegates were then given a scenario to use as a group to develop their own plan for a Mass Shelter: they were given either a large earthquake scenario that damaged a city but allowed the residents to remain or a large flood that meant residents had to be evacuated.

After lunch each group presented their ideas for MaSC solution to the other attendees. Each group was given a score for their presentation: table 4 were judged to be the winning table of those that developed the flood plan and table 5 were the winners of the earthquake tables.

Session 8 began with a presentation on Sequencing and Logistics from Martin Keitsch, German Federal Agency for Technical Relief (THW), which can be read [here](#). This presentation led into the task on developing a 5 day schedule for MaSC. The final presenter of the workshop was Mical De Boer, De Boer Structures, who outlined how his company has previously set up temporary shelters quickly. The workshop was closed by David Hickey.
